We have learnt several groups of nouns and adjectives which do not have tanwîn. Most nouns and adjectives have tanwîn. Tanwîn is omitted in the following cases:

- a) When the noun or adjective has الكِتَابُّ : الكِتَابُ e.g. أَلْ
- b) When it is mudâf, e.g. كِتَابُ بِلاَلِ
- c) When it is preceded by لي e.g. أُسْتَاذٌ : يَا أُسْتَاذٌ :

But there are certain nouns and adjectives which never have tanwîn. They are called diptotes (in Arabic المَمْنُو عُ مِنَ الصَّرْفِ).

We have learnt in this book the following groups of nouns and adjectives which are diptotes:

- 1. Feminine proper nouns e.g. آمِنَةُ ، زَيْنَبُ
- 2. Masculine proper nouns ending in "ta marbûtah" (ة) e.g. أُسَامَةُ
- 3. Masculine proper nouns ending in «-ân» e.g. عُثْمَانُ ، رَمَضَانُ
- 4. Adjectives on the pattern of فَعْلاَنُ e.g. مُلاِّنُ ، مُلاِّنُ
- أَحْمَدُ ، أَنْوَرُ e.g. أَفْعَلُ e.g. أَفْعَلُ e.g. أَفْعَلُ أَوْرَ كَالِيَّا أَفْعَلُ أَوْرَ أَوْرَ
- أَسْوَدُ ، أَحْمَرُ e.g. أَفْعَلُ e.g. أَفْعَلُ 6. Adjectives on the pattern
- مِ لِيْمُ ، لَنْدَنُ ، بَاكِسَتَانُ 7. Non-Arabic proper nouns e.g., أَنْدَنُ ، بَاكِسَتَانُ
- 8. The following patterns of broken plural:
 - أَصْدِقَاءُ ، أَغْنِيَاءُ ، أَقْوِيَاءُ أَفْعِلاَءُ وَأَفْعِلاَءُ وَأَوْعِلاَءُ وَأَوْعِلاَءُ وَ
 - فُقَرَاءُ ، زُمَلاَءُ ، وُزَرَاءُ وَزُرَاءُ , e.g.
 - مَسَاجِدُ ، فَنَادِقُ ، مَكَاتِبُ e.g. مَفَاعِلُ ر
 - مَنَادِيْلُ ، مَفَاتِيْحُ ، فَنَاجِيْنُ ، مَفَاتِيْحُ ، فَنَاجِيْنُ و.g.

Note that أُطْبِناءُ is originally أُطْبِبَاءُ on the pattern of أُطْبِناءُ, but because of the assimilation of the two "b"s, the form has been slightly changed.

Ex.1: Read and write the following words keeping in mind the rule concerning the diptote. (A diptote has no tanwîn, but has only one dammah, whereas other nouns and adjectives have two dammahs.)
